Everytown estimated the number of firearms sold for each month and year using the same methodology used by the Small Arms Survey, an adaptation of the method used by Small Arms Analytics & Forecasting, which estimates that 1.1 firearms are sold for each handgun and long gun check, and 2 firearms are sold for each ‘multiple’ check conducted. The state-level numbers are as provided by the FBI and the sum of these numbers do not equal the US totals that the FBI provides in their reporting. Everytown also excluded the US territories from this analysis.
